-THE A, B, C'S OF BIBLE STUDY-Many who have had their interest awakened to Bible study ask where to begin and in what order to study the Word. Altho all the Scriptures are profitable, yet for those who would like to get the fundamentals of TRUTH FOR TODAY quickly, I would recommend the following;

1. THE GOSPEL OF JOHN. John does not deal with any calling such as the KINGDOM or the CHURCH, but his purpose in writing was THAT YE MIGHT BELIEVE THAT JESUS IS THE CHRIST, THE SON OF GOD; AND THAT BELIEVING YE MIGHT HAVE LIFE THRU HIS NAME. (20:31)

John does not present Christ as the King of Israel or as the Head Word, the Savior of the world. It is possible for a man to have life and yet make no further progress. For him there is no calling with a hope, nor can he run for a prize or strive for a crown.

2. THE EPISTLE TO THE ROMANS. Here are found further steps in the sation of the Mystery. We should relationship of the believer to God. The great theme is JUSTIFICA-TION BY FAITH. It tells how the believer is made RIGHTEOUS. It reveals the great secret of how that God can be JUST and at the same time the JUSTIFIER of the ungodly.

Eph. can never be grasped or understood until the believer has the great foundational truths of the inner portion of Rom., 5:12 to 8:39. The practical truths of Rom. 6 are a prerequisite to the understanding of Eph. 2:1 and onward.

3. THE EPISTLE TO THE EPHESIANS. Here is truth for the believer who would go on unto perfection. Here is the only revelation of how the believer can conform himself to God's purpose during the present dispensation of grace. The position or calling offered in Eph. is an essential requirement for one who would run the race lawfully. This calling has a hope far above that of any other calling. There is a walk connected with the calling which should balance the doctrinal teaching.

-DOCTRINE AND PRACTICE-

No book in the Bible is more perfectly balanced as to doctrine and practice than the epistle to the Ephesians. There are 6 chapters, the first 3 mainly doctring, and the last 3 practice.

The dictionary says of the word PRACTICAL, "Having to do with action or practice rather than that or theory." Since the basic meaning of DOCTRINE is teaching, it would correspond to that or theory.

There can be no practice that would be pleasing to God without doctrine. Such would be like a man doing a piece of work without observing the directions. Any work or practice presupposes doctrine or of the Church, but as the Incarnate directions. We usually expect a man to have the right to know what he is doing and why he is doing it. Certainly he could not be the best kind of workman if he was in ignorance of what he was doing. So it is in the outworking of the doctrine and practice of the present dispenknow something of God's plans and purpose for the ages, and our place in them. No man can walk worthy of the calling except he know the doctrine.

On the other hand, all doctrine and no practice can end in disasteri in a short time. The case of Saul, king of Israel, is a classice example. He had the doctrine as long as he was diligent in the practice, but just as soon as he failed to practice the doctrine, then he failed and was rejected. God would reveal no more doctrine to him. An evil spirit took possession and he then turned to the powers of darkness for light since God would no longer speak to him. His tragic end is a warning to all who would fail to balance doctrine and practice.

When a man has light and refuses to walk by it, then he is likely to be given a strong delusion that he may be deceived. He may become the leader of a false sect or ism. The holding of a doctrine without the practice is nothing but having a form of godliness but denying the power thereof.

This good news was for Gentile believers or saints. It was good news for the Jew too. This wonderful revelation was made about 62 A.D. The apostle Paul was writing.

For some time before this, about 21 years, the Gentile had been admitted to the kingdom hope. But altho he was blest, he, during all those years; could not be a channel of blessing. Israel, and Israel only, was the chosen channel of blessing to the nations of the parth. To them pertained the service of God. To them was given the oracles of God. No one else could preach the Word or do service to God. The Gentile position still was not much better than that of a dog picking up the crumbs that fell from the master's table.

In the church of Acts 10 to 28 the Gentile was far off in that he could not enter the temple. The wall of partition kent him out. This was a continuous reminder of this inferior position. The promises were to Israel. The covenants were to Israel. The Messiah belonged to Israel. God was the God of Israel. a precarious position which was ex-ing. (Symptoms). plained by the picture of the wild olive branch graffed into the true olive tree. You can well imagine that the Gentile believers in the church during Acts felt slighted and inferior.

But the good news written to the saints at Ephesus changed all this. No longer was there enmity between 'Jewish and Gentile believers as before. There was a new calling and ia new hope offered in which Jew and! Gentile could be in absolute equality. In the kingdom dispensation that could never be true. But the church which is the Body of Christ allows no differences in members.

This good news had been hid in God from ages and generations. It could not be revealed until the Jew had been to be what he had been chosen to be vainly PU by his fleshly mind. and had rejected the SALVATION of God. This is somewhat parallel to the revealing of the image of Dan. 9. It was revealed only after [Israel ceased to be a kingdom.

-PU-

This is an old disease. It has been known from the beginning of the history of man. It even at one time afflicted one of the highest created beings, the archangel Lucifer and caused his downfall. It is no respecter of persons. It strikes the rich and the poor. It strikes the noble as well as the peasant. It has caused terrible destruction among God's people.

Its first symptoms are pride, arrogance, boastfulness, and intolerance. It causes an abnormal appetite for the praise of men. A man afflicted by this dread disease will go to almost any length to obtain that praise. It will affect his veracity. His honesty will! slip away. Finally his testimony will be almost completely paralized and useless. In the final stages of failure the unfortunate victim will snarl and bite at most anybody in sight because of persecution complex.

PU is mentioned 6 times in the Scriptures. Six is the number of man and his failure in the flesh.

3. The next verse. Same setting.

4. 1 Cor. 5.2. Many have failed in the walk. They have neglected practical teaching and have even fallen into fornication. PU is usually found in those who neglect the practical teachings of the Word.

5. In 1 Cor. 13:4 we learn that love vaunteth not itself, is not PU. A man cannot have this disease and at the same time love his neighbor as himself. Love is a vitamin that prevents PU.

6. In Col. 2:18 we find, Let no man beguile you of your reward in a voluntary humility and worshipping of angels, INTRUDING INTO given his opportunity THOSE THINGS THICH HE HATH NOT SEEN.

Do not hastily condemn these unfortunates, but pray earnestly for them that they may be delivered.

Pray for me that I may not fall victim to this terrible plague.

-ONE-

I AND MY FATHER ARE ONE. It made no difference in what manner God chose to manifest Himself, He was always ONE. Our God is ONE GOD, so Israel were taught in the wilderness, and that is truth yet today.

Since God in all His manifestations is still one God, it follows that He has but one mind and one will. Thus it was that He could say THE SON CAN DO NOTHING OF HIMSELF. Again the Son said. I CAN OF MINE OWN SELF DO NOTHING.

Just as surely as God cannot lie, neither can be tempted of evil just so surely He cannot work independently in any manifestation. In the temptation of the Lord in the wilderness, Satan hoped to be able to bring about this very thing. He probably did not realize the true nature of the Lord and His oneness with the Father. He may have imagined that the Lord was a creature like unto himself and therefore Subject to temptation. At least that is what he is teaching many of his dupes today.

Every act performed and every word uttered by the Lord when here upon by Himself as the Father. His manifestation in the flesh was as a characteristics of those who have servant. He was in perfect accord with Himself as Father in all things. Any limitations were selfimposed. He was never on the level of man in knowledge and power. At times He chose not to know or to reveal His knowledge. If He at any time seemed powerless, it was be-

When God manifested Himself in flesh, He had but one object in view -- redemption. He could follow no other course than the one He did and accomplish His purpose. He might have blazed forth in all His glory in the temptation and destroyed Satan on the spot. But where would that have left you and mc? Under condemnation forever.

God's way was the way of the cross. Our guilt made it so. Our sin allowed no alternative. Our sin nailed Him to the cross.

Let us never forget our responsibility, but always praise Him for His matchless grace.

-CROSS, TOMB, SUFFERINGS-

The only meeting place for the sinner and God is at the cross and the empty tomb. At the cross the Lord became sin and suffered, the Just for the unjust. As a lamb He was the substitute, taking upon Himself the penalty of sin (death) and died for the sinner. But that was not enough, for death had past upon the whole race for the sin of Adam. so that in Adam all die. Since the time of Adam men are already dead. So there is need for release from the power of death. That was manifested by the open tomb. It is the resurrection power which gives a man a new life.

Resurrection life has two aspects. It is first manifested here and now by spiritual life in the believer. VERILY, VERILY, I SAY UNTO YOU, HE THAT HEARETH MY WORD, AND BELLEVETH ON HIM THAT SENT ME. HATH EVERLASTING LIFE, AND SHALL NOT COME INTO CONDEMNATION; BUT IS PASSED FROM DEATH UNTO LIFE. The common supposition concerning this verse is that eternal life is conditioned by hearing and believing. But the only one who can hear and on earth was determined and decided believe is one who has eternal life. This verse tells us that the main eternal life are hearing and believing. Eternal life is received as a gift, not on any imposed conditions. The possession of eternal life is a guarantee against any possibility of condemnation. Only the dead come into condemnation.

But if the believer would then cause He chose not to use His power have fellowship with Christ, he must go back of the cross and the empty tomb to the Lord's sufferings. Suffering must precede the reigning with Him. If we would fellowship with Him, we must take up our cross and follow Him and be identified with Him in His sufferings. There is no other way to have the mind of Christ. There is no other road to take if we would share in His glory. It will cost us the whole world in order to share in His manifestation in glory. The way of the cross, the empty tomb, and the fellowship of His sufferings is the only way that leads home.
