-THE PROMISE-
Not all promises were made to Abraham and the fathers. There are some for us too. But we must be careful that we do not take unto ourselves some promises that are not for us.

Today we camnot claim any of the promises which were made concerning the land that was promised to Abraham, nor any that pertain to the kingdom.

But there is a great promise which we can claim and meditate upon, and in which we can rejoice. There are three references to this great promise.

1. ". . . Gentiles. . . . partakers of His promise in Christ by the gospel." Eph .3:6.

This promise is in connection with a special gospel which had been committed to Paul. This gospel also has to do with the preaching of the unsearchable riches of Christ among the Gentiles.

This promise then seems to have a special place in the gospel of the dispensation of the mystery which was revealed to Paul after Acts 28:28. You will have to read all of chapter 3 in order to get all the context.
2. "...according to the promise of life which is in Christ Jesus." 2 Tim.1:1. Again we find from the context that this promise is vitally connected with the apostleship of Paul. The promise is mamed. It is the promise of LIFE. Now ove know that other gospels had to do with life. Then what is there so special about this one?
3. "In hope of eternal life, which God, that cannot lie, promised before the world (ages) began." Titus 1:2

Here we have another important item. This life, this eternal life, was promised before the ages began. Again it is also connected with the ministry and apostleship of Paul.

Notice that expression, "God, that cannot lie." Satan was a liar from the beginning (of the ages). Can we conclude that this promise was made at the time when Satan fell and brot ruin into all of God's order? With this ruin came death. Life is the opposite of death. It is the only answex to the question as to the way out of all this sin and misery and death.

Other gospels look back only to the fime expressed as "from the foundation of the world. "But here is one that goes back to the time of the choice of those linitiated into the secret (Eph. 1:4).
"If a man keep my saying; he shall never see death." John 8:51

The meaning of this verse has been lost somewhat in the translation. In the Bagster Interlinear it reads, "If anyone word my keep, death in no wise shall he see forever."

If we were to paraphrase it in modern English, we would say, "If anyone keeps my word, he shall not stay dead forever." See the note on this verse in the Companion Bible, page 1539.

This is equivalent to saying that the believer shall not perish. The word PERISH is defined for us in 1 Cor. 15:18. There it says that if folks do not rise from the dead, then they have persihed.

John 8:51 and 3:16 have a great deal in common. In 3:16 the believer shall not perish (remain dead forever) but shall have everlasting life (which cannot be had without resurrection).

We have 4 expressions in John 6 which express about the same sentiment.

1. "And this is the Father's will which hath sent Me, that of all which He hath 1 given Me I should lose nothing, but should raise it up again at the last day." 6:39
2. "And this is the will of Him that sent Me, that everyone which seeth the Son, and believeth on Him, may have everlasting life; and I will raise him up at the last day. " 6:40
3. "No man can come to Me, except the Father which hath sent Me draw him: and I will raise him up at the last day." 6:44
4. "Whoso eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, hath eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day." 6:54.

There is no mention here of the unbelievers being raised. Neither would there be any advantage for the believer if that were so. We are left to conclude that those who perish will never rise.

In Matt. 16:18 the Lord declares that the gates of hell (the grave) shall not prevail against the church (believers). The plain inference is that those gates will prevail against the unbelievers. If not, then what advantage have the believers?

Kn Eph. $1: 19$ it is plainly stated that resurrection power is to us-ward who believe. That great power which raised Christ from the dead and which works in the believers will never be profaned by its use on those who do not believe.
-STUDIES IN EPHESIANS - \#l
The salutation to this epistle makes up verses 1 and 2.

First of all, it is addressed to SAINTS. Saints are believers. The word has in it the idea of PURE or CLEANSED. God cleanses every orphan which He adopts into His family.

It is alsoaddressed to the FAITHFUL. Faithful means "full of faith." It is faith in action. No others are addressed. Thes saints and faithful are the ones who have already believed the gospel of the dis-
pensation of the mystery, for, upon hearit they TRUSTED. 1:13

We might pursue the word faithful a |little farther. Today we find many who have learned of the mystery. They have sat under teachers and profess to believe iit. Eut as far as any activity is concerned they are dead. They do not seem to care whether anybody else hears about it or not. It has not changed their way of living. They cling to the same filthy habits and ways of speaking. So theirs is not an lactive faith. It is merely head knowledge and has never gotten so far as the heart. It is the result of believing a teacher, rather than going to the Word and learning things for themselves. These folks are intensely partizan. They will not Grook anything contrary to their favorite teacher or what he teaches.

When speaking of the folks at Berea, Paul said that they were more noble than those at Thessalonica for they searched the Scriptures daily to see whether Paul was right. Paul praised them because they questioned his teaching. Would that we had more teachers like that today!

You will never be justified by believ:ing me or anybody else. It is only by believing God that a man is justified. If your teacher or preacher, or what have you, does not drive you to the Book to search for truth, then you are still dead.

Paul asked that grace and peace be to thern both from the 1 ather and the Son.

Grace is kindness or favor. That will be to saints and faithful thruout the ages to come (2:7). So it is not just a passing fancy.

Peace for the Christian is that inward itranquility which comes from a full trust in Him who is able to keep us. The perison who is not kind and loving to his fellow men cannot have this peace.
So the stage is set for the message.

## -LEANNESS OF SOUL-

When Israel was redeemed from the bondage of Egypt and taken into the wilderness, they soon forgot the good thing God had done for them and began to lust lafter good things to eat. They did not istop to think that the God who had delivered them from bondage could also do other wonderful things for them. So instead of waiting for God's provision they tempted eGod and the record says, "And He gave them their request; but sent leanness finto their soul." Psa. 106:15

These folks did not realize that God had a new way of dealing with them, or we might say, a new dispensation. They were looking back to the old things. They suffered loss because of it.

When the Syro-Phoenician wornan came to the Loxd for the healing of her daughter, she also made a mistake about dispensation. She addressed Him as Son of David. He reminded her that He had come only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. She was a Gentile. She had no right to use that title of Him. She had no right to expect to share in the blessings that were only for Israel. But the Lord gave her a little clue and she grasped it eagerly. He spoke of the little dogs, those that were household pets, not the large dogs which were the outcasts of the fields and streets. So she called Him Lord and her request was granted. Blessing came as the result of right dispensational division. The same is true today.

Today we have many who think that the kingdorn is still being offered. They try to observe rituals and ordinances that belong only to Israel. Then they wonder why they lack power and why they have so little joy and satisfaction.

The kingdom had to do with earthly things and blessing:. Zoday God is offer ing all spiritual blessings in heavenly places. Today is the time to put the affections on things above, not on things on the earth. Today is not the time when the meek shall inherit the earth.

Is it any wonder then that the professing church is powerless? It has what it has asked for, just as did Israel. It has wealth. It has political influence. It has a name that it is a live church, but it is 'dead spiritually (Rev. 3:1).

Also many who have realized the truth of the mystery have drawn back to loss of joy and blessing. They, too, are dead.
