-STUDIES IN EPHESIANS-

This time we take up a study of the expression "The Lord Jesus Christ." It is found 7 times in the epistle.

Last month in the study of the word FATHER, which occurs in the epistle 8 times, you will notice that the two central references are to ACCESS and to PRAYER. Likewise in this study of the phrase THE LORD JESUS CHRIST, the central member has to do with prayer.

Our Lord spent much time in prayer. The apostle Paul also spent much time in prayer, especially for the saints. We should note this and question whether we are spending the time in prayer that we ought, especially for the saints.

The title, THE LORD JESUS CHRIST,

appears in;

1:2. Grace and peace, to saints.

1:3. Sonship, spiritual blessings.

1:17. Gift of wisdom & revelation. 3:14. Sonship, bow knees to Father.

5:20. Giving thanks in the name.

6:23. Sonship, peace and love.

6:24. Grace, with all that love.

The term LORD (kurios) means a ruler and owner. The rest of the expression, Jesus Christ, refers to the one who humbled Himself and was then exalted. He is the owner of every believer, not because He is the Creator, but because He is the Redeemer. We do well to call Him LORD (John 13:13).

As each of the above references is studied in its context, we discover that all spiritual blessings have their origin in God the Father, and the Lord Jesus Christ is the channel by which they can come to us. We do not attempt to describe or define Spiritual Blessings.

In the context of 1:17 we discover that it is God who gives the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ. A full knowledge of Christ is necessary for a comprehension of the mystery of Christ. This had not been known fully in other ages and generations as it is now. This knowledge is inseparably linked with the knowledge of the dispensation of the mystery. Many may have a head knowledge of the fact that there was a dispensational boundry at Acts 28:28, but that does not guarantee that they have a knowledge of The Mystery. Against the giving of knowledge in 1:17 is the giving of thanks in 5:20. For not being thankful, see Rom. 1:21.

## -COMFORT-

Some folks at the church of Thessalonica needed some comfort. They had been looking for the coming of the Lord to set up His kingdom here on the earth. But the coming was delayed and in the meantime several of the believers had died. Friends and relatives were very concerned about this condition. What is to happen to those who will not be here when the Lord comes?

So in 4:13 Paul says that he does not want them to be ignorant of the facts. He describes the dead believers as asleep. They have not perished as have all the unbelievers. Death for the believer is as a sleep. See Psa. 17:15.

So Paul gives three reasons why they should not worry. 1. God will bring them from the dead. 2. Those who are alive will not in any way precede them. 3. The both shall be caught up together.

They are to comfort each other with these words. In the light of modern theology, this seems rather foolish. Today these folks would be told by the most enlightened (?) theologians that they need not worry, their friends and relatives who have fallen asleep are with the Lord in heaven. But the Word does not say such a thing anywhere. The truth is that they are dead and their only hope is in resurrection. That is fundamental.

As a rule, another word in this passage does not get a very full explanation. It is MEET. In the Greek it occurs in Matt. 25:1, 6; Acts 28:15 and here. In each of the other instances it means to go out to meet somebody and come back with that person or party. That is also what it means here. Christ is coming to the earth to set up His kingdom. As He comes, all who have the hope of the kingdom, both the dead and the living, will be caught up to meet Him in the air and come back with Him. From that time they will always be with Him.

This resurrection and rapture is not for the church of the dispensation of the mystery. Its members are not destined to be with the Lord on the earth, but in the heavenlies. However, this is a subject for another paper.

Our main point we would like for you to see is the fact that the only hope of the dead is resurrection, and that is only for those who are said to be asleep in Christ. That is for believers only.

In Matt. 26:17 the disciples say, "Where wilt thou that we prepare for thee to eat the passover?" In the next verse they are to quote the Lord as saying, "I will keep the passover..." In verse 19 we read, "and they made ready the passover." Then we read on and find that the Lord did eat the passover with His disciples.

In Mark 14:12 the disciples ask, "Where wilt thou that we go and prepare that thou mayest eat the passover." In the 14th verse He is to be quoted, "Where is the guestchamber, where I shall eat

the passover with my disciples?" And verse 16 says, "and they made ready the passover." Mark then records the eat-

ing of the passover as did Matthew. In Luke 22:8 the Lord says to Peter and John, "Go and prepare us the passover that we may eat." They are to say to a certain man, "Where is the questchamber, where I shall eat the passover with my disciples?" That is verse 11. Then in verse 13 we find, "and they made ready the passover." Then note what the Lord says in verse 15: "With desire have I desired to eat this passover with you before I suffer." Then follows the ac-

count of the eating of the passover.

In each of the above instances we find the word PASSOVER used over and over. There is nothing to indicate that it is any- does not mention it. Of the 7 epistles thing but the passover.

John is writing to Gentiles and they were forever forbidden to partake of it. See Exodus 12:43, 45, 48. There is no record that this law was ever changed.

In I Cor. 10 and 11 Paul is speaking to those whose fathers had passed thru the sea and those chapters are directions for the observance of the passover. It is very much like the record in Matt., Mark, and Luke. See 10:16 where he speaks of the cup of blessing which was one of the 4 cups of the passover.

Now go back and read Mt. 26:28, Mk. 14:24, Lk. 22:20 and I Cor. 11:25 and in each instance it speaks of the "cup of the new testament (covenant)." The new testament was for Jews only, the house of Israel and the house of Judah (Jer. 31:31). God has no covenant with the Gentiles. He has dealt with them in grace from Acts 10 till now.

Now why do people try to make the passover something else, and why do Gentiles presume to observe it?

When Paul had finished his missionary journeys and was on his way to Jerusalem for the last time, he stopped at Miletus and talked with the elders of the church of Ephesus. This was a last message to them in that they should see his face no more. Acts 20:16-38.

Among other things, he said to them, "Wherefore I take you to record this day, that I am pure from the blood of all men. For I have not shunned to declare unto you all the counsel of God. " Acts 20:26, 27. Especially note the words ALL THE COUNSEL OF GOD!

When we read and study the 14 epistles and all the works and words of Paul in Acts, we may be a little surprised to find that not once does Paul use the word HELL. This might be quite a shock to the strictly orthodox. But at least up to Acts 20 Paul has not preached anything about hell and yet he claims to have declared all the counsel of God and wherefore is pure from the blood of all men.

What are we to make of this? Was Paul mistaken? Did he neglect a solemn duty, as many today would see it? Or have we overlooked something about this word HELL?

Matt. uses the term 8 times; Mark 3 times; and Luke 3 times. John's gospel written by the apostles to the Circumcision John does not tell of this passover, forit is used twice, once by James and once in 2 Peter. It is used 4 times in the Rev. and that is all the occurances in the N T.

Since it is used only in the gospels and epistles to the Circumcision, could it be that hell is for Jews only? Then, too, many think that hell is the lake of fire, but that cannot be for the lake of fire is a place into which hell will finally be cast.

It might be well that we make a little investigation and find out what hell is. Then we might find the reason for Paul not using the term.

But when we start that, we must find what it is in the original. There we find something very interesting. After all, Paul did use the word, but only once! It is found in I Cor. 15:55. "O grave, where is thy victory?" We need go no farther to find its meaning.

It may shock you, but the truth is that every person who dies goes to hell. That is where I expect to go when I die. I am no better than my Lord. He went to hell when He died. See Psa. 16:10.
