-STUDIES IN EPHESIANS- #1

The word RICHES occurs 5 times in Eph. Five is the number of grace, so we would naturally expect RICHES to be in some way connected with grace. And so it is, for we have not only riches of His grace (1:7), but we have the exceeding riches of His grace (2:7). But let us take up the references in their order.

1. 1:7. It is in Christ that we have redemption from the death that came upon all the children of Adam. The price of that redemption was the precious blood of Christ. In that redemption, bought with His blood, was included forgiveness of sins, thus making peace. All this according to the RICHES of the grace of God. These riches are far beyond our limited comprehension.

2. 1:18. This is a part of Paul's prayer for the saints. There are three things he prays that they might know. This know-ledge can never be obtained without the eyes of the understanding being enlightened. The second thing he wants them to know is the RICHES of the glory of His inheritance (Christ's) in the saints. Of course it had been known to ages and generations that Israel should be Christ's inheritance, but the mystery was that He should have the Gentiles for an inheritance upon the failure of Israel.

3. 2:7. The RICHES of being quickened together with Christ, raised up together with Him, and seated with Him in the heavenlies seems incomprehensible to the majority. But that is only the beginning of the RICHES. This makes possible the fact that in the ages to come He might shew the exceeding RICHES of His grace in His kindness toward us thru Christ Jesus. What a Savior and God!

4. 3:8. Unto Paul was given grace that he might preach the unsearchable (untrackable, untraceable) RICHES of Christ AMONG THE GENTILES. There is no trace of this great gospel in all the prophets, or in any Scriptures up to this time. It was a mystery that had been hid. This was an eternal purpose. How vital to you and to me!

5. 3:16. The first mention was the RICHES OF GRACE, but here it is the RICHES OF GLORY. In both the word ACCORDING is present. Here is a prayer that we might be strengthened according to the RICHES of His glory so that Christ may dwell in our hearts by???

-THE MEETING IN THE AIR-

In Bullinger's Critical Lexicon and Concordance MEET is defined as meaning; "To come or go from a place towards a person; and so to meet face to face from opposite directions; esp., to meet and come back with the person."

Looking in Hudson's Greek and English Concordance we find that the word MEET as used in 1 Thess. 4:17 is apantesis. It is used here with eis and also the same in three other places. Let us look at them.

1. Matt. 25:1. "Then shall the kingdom of heaven be likened unto ten virgins which took their lamps and went forth to MEET the bridegroom." We know that according to the customs of the times these virgins would go out to meet the bridegroom and come back with him. So we can establish a part of the meaning here at least. But the Companion Bible note says that the Greek word here in the texts is hupantesis, as it is in John 12:13. There it reads, "Took branches of palm trees, and went forth to MEET Him." We read further that He went right on into the city and they with Him. So this agrees with Matt. 25:1.

2. Matt. 25:6. "go ye out to MEET him." This is again about the wedding and meeting and coming back with the bridegroom.

3. Acts 28:15. "they came to MEET us as far as Apii forum." Here the brethren came out from Rome, met Paul, and went back with him.

4. 1 Thess. 4:17. "Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to MEET the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord." Long after the writing of this epistle Paul said that he was bound for the hope of Israel (Acts 28:20). The hope of Israel was the coming of the Lord to set up His kingdom here on the earth. Paul was comforting some of the folks who had friends and relatives who had died before the coming of the Lord had taken place and they were worried as to what would become of them. Paul says plainly to them that when the Lord comes, both the living and the dead who are looking for that coming will be caught up to MEET Him in the air and come back with Him as He keeps on to His course to the earth and so will they ever be with Him. Check this carefully!

## -TILL HE COME -

In TFT #74 appeared an article which gave three reasons why that I, a Gentile, could not partake of the Lord's Supper. There is a fourth reason which is so important that a separate article must be given to it. That reason is that I, having received and believed the truth of the dispensation of the mystery and having the hope of heaven and not of the kingdom, do not expect or look for the Lord's coming.

Just as a matter of review, we must note that the Lord gave a new meaning to the Passover or Lord's Supper. It was to be done in remembrance of Him. He said that He would no more observe it until He did so with them in the Father's kingdom. See Matt. 26:29. Mark 14:25. Luke 22:15 (called Passover) 16,18. It is noteworthy that John does not give any account of this event because he was writing after Acts and to and for us Gentiles. See John 1:11.

In 1 Cor. 10 and 11 Paul is speaking to the Jewish members of the Corinthian church, for in 10:1 he speaks of their fathers being under the cloud and passing thru the sea and does not mention the Gentile members till 12:2. When we see the context, it is easy to see why that he should be speaking to Jews in 10 and 11. He is giving instructions about the observance of a Jewish feast. This was a part of the law (Lev. 23) and the council at Jerusalem had absolved the Gentiles from all responsibility to the law, but recognized that God was dealing with them in grace. Read Acts 15.

But the notable thing we should notice in 1 Cor. 11 is that in verse 26 Paul says that they do shew the Lord's death till He come. The Lord's coming is the hope of the kingdom, and pertains to those who will live on the earth in resurrection. It is for those who, if they are meek, will inherit the earth. This inheritance is for the seed of Abraham, thru Isaac and thru Jacob, limited to the 12 tribes.

But the members of the church of the dispensation of the mystery do not look for His coming. Rather, they look for His manifestation (epiphaneia) in the heavenly places. They will be present at the great coronation preceding the coming.

In view of all these things, it would be impossible for me to walk worthy of my calling and at the same time partake of the Lord's Supper. What think you?

## -THE CONDITIONS FOR LIFE-

The penalty for Adam's sin was death. Sacrifice of an animal and being clothed with the skins took care of sin and restored fellowship with God. But the hope of a resurrection, which was the only answer to death, was in the Seed of woman who would crush the serpent's head. If Adam put his trust in that, and we are pretty sure that he did, then Adam will be resurrected to enter into the new earth.

Job had a knowledge of his Redeemer. How he obtained this knowledge, we do not know. It is reasonable to suppose that he lived before Moses did. He may have had access to the tablets written by Adam and others after him, but this we do know; he spoke more of the stars of the heavens than all the rest of the writers combined. Those of you who have read "The Witness of the Stars" by Bullinger or even App. No. 12 in the Companion Bible, will realize that Job may have had the message of the stars pure and uncontaminated as yet by heathen mythology. So he too could see in the heavens the strong One ready to crush the head of the serpent. This was his Redeemer and he believed. Job also has the hope of resurrection and an entrance into the new earth.

After the choosing of Abram from Ur of the Chaldees we find that Gentiles still could know God. An example is Melchisidec. Also Balaam and others may be mentioned.

Peter was forced to admit "Of a truth I perceive that God is no respecter of persons: But in every nation he that feareth Him, and worketh righteousness, is accepted with Him." Acts 10:34, 35.

At both Lystra and Athens, when Paul was in the presence of raw heathen who knew nothing of the Scriptures, a gospel was preached which was akin to the everlasting gospel proclaimed by the angel in Rev. 14:7. It was to give glory to God the Creator. This also is similar to the confession of Peter in the house of Cornelius.

We may be surprised at the great multitudes of so-called heathen who have been saved simply by realizing that there is a Creator, indicated by His handiwork, and have worshipped Him and put their trust in Him. We have no reason to doubt that God would reveal Himself to any who diligently seeks Him out.

All these in no way change the truth of John 3:16. See john 1:3.

word epouranios (heavenlies) in the book of Eph. Thus;

A / 1:3 Us, blessed. Spiritual.

B / 1:20 Principalities and powers. C / Us. Seated.

B / 3:10 Principalities and powers.

A / 6:12 We, wrestle. Wickedness. Very, very often the occurances of words or phrases may be put on a structure like this. Then note the pairs and note the central one or pair as the case may be. The central one of course gives |tual one. the main thot or theme of the whole argument. In the above example we find that the message that is brot forward is that we are seated in the heavenlies in Christ, and with a purpose; that God might shew to us the exceeding riches of His grace in the ages to come. This is the very heart of Ephesians.

Now turn to Rom. 10:9, 10 and see if you can make a simple one for yourself. You have two words, heart and mouth.

I am sure that you will enjoy your Bible so much more if you will pay a little attention to these structures and note how they explain the Word.

Everything sown to the flesh brings forth only corruption (loss). The flesh is as the grass of the field. Today it may flourish and be beautiful. Tomorrow it may wither away and be forgotten. Every man, in the flesh, is slated for death from which how they explain each other and especially there is no return. Resurrection can only come from having a new nature, a spiri-
